Lonesome Dove Equestrian Center hits a major milestone

Clint Arrington, the founding director of Lonesome Dove, is thrilled at how his program has grown over the years. Sherry Newark, one of the organization's volunteers and as she describes herself "Clint's better half," says that she's been very pleased to get a few "walk-ins" of late – i.e. veteran's who see Lonesome Dove's sign or hear about it through word of mouth and come in without the push of a therapist or doctor.

"In the last two years so many people have been coming out," Newark said happily.
